Information on the NYS Social Emotional Learning Standards and Benchmarks will be included in the course, as well as information about NYS laws on student privacy.

discussion and additional coursework learn how to use the Collaborative and Proactive Solutions Model by Dr. Greene. Participants may either purchase or borrow the book, Lost at School for the course. The participants will learn proactive strategies to work with behaviorally challenging students, focusing on the factors contributing to these challenging classroom behaviors. The Collaborative and Proactive Solutions model will assist the participants in creating helping relationships with all students, including at risk students.
