Familiar with the many visual components for instruction after MSV(Meaning, Structure, Vision)? It's not just about phonics any more! Shifting the Balance: 6 Ways to Bring the Science of Reading into the Balanced Literacy Classroom by Jan Burkins and Kari Yates is based on the science of reading, and will be very helpful for improving your instruction. The book is divided into six chapters on the various components of early reading which we will explore in six sessions. Through reading, discussion, and activities you will enhance your understanding of better instruction of the reading process within the structure of developing readers. Our facilitator will lead you in exploring conversations about reading comprehension, phonemic, and phonological processing systems. Discussions will also include ideas on orthography, responsive phonics instruction and choosing balanced texts to support early reading.

Activities beyond reading the text include participation in session discussions, a short written comment on each chapter's instructional suggestion/activities and a final project of your choice related to the material read.



lives and the lives of our students. It is a subtle but profound shift in our approach to trauma that allows each of us to understand our past so that we may clear a path to our healthy future. It allows us as teachers to help our students work through their trauma.

Participants will develop an understanding that student behavior is not because the child is "bad."; there are direct links between childhood trauma and ADHD (symptoms) and other behavior issues. If we understand the child, we can understand behaviors and work in a trauma informed manner to address issues that hinder learning.
